After-School Programs Spring 2015

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All After-School programs are supervised by our After-School Coordinator Ms. Kim Hayes (khayes@gardenschool.org)

After-School Program (Nursery to 6th Grade)

Our after-school program for the lower division (N-6) runs weekdays from 3:00-6:00 p.m. and includes snack time, homework help, indoor/outdoor play, organized games, crafts, clubs and special events. The program structure is flexible, so you can arrange an after-school plan that meets your family's needs.



7th- and 8th-Grade

Garden School has a program for 7th and 8th graders. The After-School Program operates every school day from 3:00-6:00 p.m. to offer homework support and structured activities, including cards, board games, support for sports teams, and free play in the gym or field.

Students who choose to remain at school after 3:00 p.m. and who are not in extra help with a teacher, in a club, on a team, or attending a Foundations course are automatically enrolled in the After-School Program and billed at the daily rate.

After-School Program Rates Per Hour/Day Rates:

- Until 4:00 p.m.: \$12
- Until 5:00 p.m.: \$18
- Until 5:00 p.m. \$18
- Until 6:00 p.m.: \$25

Programs end at 6:00 p.m. In the event of an emergency, please call the school. Pick-ups after 6:00 p.m. will result in an additional charge of \$10/half hour.

Full-Year Discount Rates:

- Until 4:00 p.m. for the year: \$1,700
- Until 5:00 p.m. for the year: \$2,200
- Until 6:00 p.m. for the year: \$2,800

Timely payments are required to qualify for the full-year discount rates. These rates are per family—they are the same regardless of the number of children a family has enrolled in the program. Students enrolled full time for the After-School Program receive a discount on Foundations classes, paying \$180 for the first course and \$130 for each additional course

All Foundations classes are subject to change due to a teacher's absence. If your child's class is cancelled, he or she may attend After-School until pick-up. There will be no charge for the time your child would have been in the lesson.

- In the interest of safety and security, all students in grade 8 and lower must attend After-School if they are not in a club, class, lesson, sports team, or extra help or tutoring session. All children on campus must be supervised.
- If your child is being picked up by someone other than a known parent/guardian, please bring a note to school or contact Ms. Hayes, the After-School Coordinator. This includes family members and parents of your child's friends.
- All parents/guardians must sign the student out in the After-School book. Students are not permitted to wait outside.
- All Foundations classes are subject to cancellation if they do not receive minimum enrollment.
- Any student who is deemed by the teacher or the After-School Coordinator to be a disturbance in a Foundations class will be asked to leave the class and refunds will not be given.

About Foundations

Garden School's specialty classes are geared toward the varied interests of our students and the high standards of our parent/guardian community. Foundation classes broaden students' awareness and bring forth their skills and talents in a nurturing environment.

Unless otherwise noted in the description, classes are 1 hour long, run for 10 weeks, and start the week of February 2, 2015.

We recommend students bring a snack for the period between the end of school and the beginning of the class.

Foundations classes are **\$200 for the first course and \$150 for each additional course**, or if enrolled full-time in the After-School Program, \$180 for the first course and \$130 for each additional course.



Foundations Spring 2014 Offerings

Acrobatics (max. 10 students)

Build strength and flexibility through exercises, learn basic tumbling and gymnastics, and put all that together with dance to create an acrobatics routine you'll want to break into every chance you get.

Ballet (max. 10 students)

The perfect start for aspiring dancers! We'll begin with the 5 basic ballet positions and practice the techniques of classical ballet. We'll also learn the names of each movement and weave them together to create a beautiful ballet.

Tap Dancing (max. 12 students)

Children will learn the basic tap steps (shuffles, flaps, slides) without music – allowing their feet and bodies to literally become percussion instruments. Together, they will create music and dance that will have them dancing in the streets!

Hip Hop (max. 15 students)

Ms. Kim, brings us "soul" with Hip Hop. For children who have had some dance experience, Hip Hop will explore some cool moves. The class will focus on isolation of movements while moving different body parts concurrently, but in different ways. Great exercise, fun, fun, fun and a fantastic way to use all of that energy!

Contemporary Dance (max 10 students)

Contemporary dance is a style of expressive dance that combines elements of several dance genres including modern, jazz, lyrical and classical ballet. Contemporary dancers strive to connect the mind and the body through fluid dance movements.

Tae Kwon Do (max. 10 students)

This course is a favorite. "The way of the hand and the foot" is not only for self-defense and exercise but is also for learning focus, self-control, discipline, and manners. Classes start with warm-ups and stretches and then move into kicking, blocking, and learning the forms—choreographed movements that help us practice our skills. Classes finish with a game and meditation.

"On the Spot" Theater

"Improv" is short for improvisational theatre, where characters and stories come from spontaneity and imagination of the actors themselves. In this program, Teaching Aritist Adam Crescenzi introduces students to the two forms of improvisational comedy, short-form and long-forth. Adam will guide students through a number of delightfully comedic and increasingly zany scenarios including the Chair Game, Scenes from a Shopping Mall, Get Past The Crossing Guard, and Family Road Trip, just to name a few. The use of masks may also be incorporated into improvisational comedy and visits from professional improv actors and clowns are also possible. Improv will help students boost their confidence, their creativity, and their collaboration skills, but most importantly, it's a whole lot of fun! The program will culminate with an improvisation performance open for family, friends, and fellow students.

Adam Crescenzi is an artist and an educator who has spent the past ten years making theatre with students in grades K-12 in over thirty New York City Public Schools. In addition to running the Theatre Program at The Garden School Summer Camp, he currently works as a teaching artist for Theatre Development Fund, Theatre for a New Audience, New York City Center Encores!, and the Flushing Council on Culture and the Arts at historic Flushing Town Hall. Originally from Milford, Massachusetts, he holds a Bachelor of Arts in Drama from Vassar College and a Master of Arts in Educational Theatre from New York University.

Greek 101 (max. 12 students)



Chess Educators

There is a significant body of research that shows the effect of chess on brain development. Students can apply chess to problem-solving skills.

In addition, chess is an academic performance booster as well as a universal "language" for people from different backgrounds – it is a perfect After-School pursuit for Garden School students! All level students are welcome.

Note: The level the student is in is determined by age and experience. Students may be evaluated and moved to the class level that best suits their ability.

Chess Level: Level 1 & 2 Introduction &

Advanced Novice (max. 12 students)

This course is designed to introduce kindergarten and first grade students to chess. The students will learn about the chessboard, pieces, basic rules, special moves, introduction to tactics, strategy, & notation. The teaching method involves a hands-on approach in which the children learn by playing games, and solving chess puzzles. The children will be exposed to pattern recognition and spatial problem solving that help develop abstract thinking. This class will be both very entertaining and educational for the children, and will help nurture good sportsmanship and social skills.

Level: 1 & 2 Introduction & Advanced Novice Day: Wednesday 3:45 p.m.



Chess Level: Level 3 & 4 Intermediate &

Advanced (max. 12 students)

This course is designed for intermediate and advanced chess players who are already familiar with the fundamentals of chess.

The students will learn about tactics, openings principles, middlegame and end game strategy, introduction to chess tournament play, rules related to advanced play.

The teaching method involves a hands-on approach in which the students learn by playing games, and solving advanced chess puzzles. The students will be exposed to the tournament play experience necessary to engage in competitions.

This class will be both entertaining and educational for the students, and will help nurture good sportsmanship, social skills, help the students gain insight into the nature of competition and learn from both winning and losing through the analysis of one's games.

Level: 3 & 4 Intermediate & Advanced Day: Wednesday 3:45p.m.

Instructor: Beatriz Marinello. WIM (Woman International Master) and United States Chess Federation Life Master Beatriz Marinello moved to the United States from her native Chile in 1990.



In 2003, Ms. Marinello was elected U.S. Chess Federation's (USCF) President, which is the first and only time a woman has ever served in that capacity. She has established and runs numerous scholastic chess programs in New York City. Ms. Marinello has also served as the USCF National Scholastic Director.

Mi Mundo en Español

(max. 10)

This is a structured Span-

program where vocabulary acquisition is encouraged based on singing, playing and crafting all in Spanish. This course emphasizes oral communication and listening comprehension so students begin to feel comfortable with the sounds of the new language through the use of music and games. In this class, students will learn the sounds of the alphabet & the very important phonemes and morphemes in order to start reading words in Spanish. Class will also teach basic greetings and vocabulary related with school, meals and games. This course is ideal for Spanish heritage children and students who have studied the language or have been previously exposed it.

Soccer (max 15) Begins Tuesday March 17



We will build prototypes using green architecture techniques and terrariums that teach us organic life cycles, sustainable agriculture, and ecological engineering. 
